QUICK USER GUIDE

Description and positioning of the Bora band® device on the arm or wrist



The Bora band® BB100 device should fit snugly and apply light pressure to your skin, without causing any discomfort. This will ensure measurement accuracy.


Good practice

- Wear your Bora band® device as often as possible, including at night.
- Take advantage of your washing/shower time to recharge the Bora band® device daily.
- The Bora band[®] deivice is only resistant to water splashes from all directions (IP64), so it is recommended **to remove it during bathing** or water activities such as **swimming**.



With the mobile application, check daily that **your device has successfully connected** to upload your data.

To start or check the operation of the Bora band® device



Stopping the Bora band® device

Press the button until the orange indicator light appears — indicating that the Bora band® BB100 device is switching off.

Other light signs

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Flashing orange: the battery is low, recharge your Bora band® BB100 device using the charger provided*.



Flashing white: the battery is charging.

The indicator light will turn off once the battery is fully charged.



Solid blue: The Bora band[®] device is installing a software update, or sending or receiving data. Please do not switch off during these operations*.



Fixed red: your Bora band® BB100 device is faulty.



- Try to turn it off and then switch it on again.
- ▶ If still faulty: contact the organisation that provided you with the Bora band® BB100 device.
